SUBJECT: A request to install new wayfinding signage along the trails of the Red Rock Ridge and Valley Trail System.

APPLICANT: Carolyn Buck, Red Rock Trail Director, Freshwater Land Trust

PREMISES: Various Red Rock trail locations in the City of Birmingham

COMMISSION ACTION:

WHEREAS, the City of Birmingham's portion of the Red Rock Ridge and Valley Trail System was adopted by the Birmingham Planning Commission on December 4, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Freshwater Land Trust is seeking to install a series of newly-designed trail signage in order to better identify the Red Rock Trail System and to provide much needed wayfinding assistance for trail users; and

WHEREAS, the series of signage was created to be low-cost and easy to update, which will allow the Freshwater Land Trust to vastly increase the amount of signage currently on the ground; and

WHEREAS, the trail signage is designed with high-contrast colors and easy-to-read fonts for accessibility, have corridor coordinated colors to make trails easily recognizable, and will feature important safety and trail rules; and

WHEREAS, the replacement and installation of the signage will occur throughout the City as funds become available, with a goal of completing the project within two years; and

WHEREAS, the Project Review Committee has been authorized by the Birmingham Planning Commission to review, modify, or approve on its behalf minor additions or alterations to existing public facilities or new minor public improvements; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Project Review Committee that the request to install new wayfinding signage along the trails of the Red Rock Ridge and Valley Trail System in the City of Birmingham is hereby APPROVED as illustrated in the document entitled: "Proposed COB Trail Sign Locations", subject to:

1. Applicant obtaining permission from the U. S. Department of Transportation to remove the original, TIGER grant-funded wayfinding signage.
2. Applicant working with the Office of City Attorney and the Department of Public Works so the City can formally accept the new wayfinding signage as City property in order to maintain them.
